2. **Amendments/Approval of Minutes** The Minutes of the 28th September were agreed by a show of hands, after a small amendment to para 7.8 The Case is Altered Public House – remove three words so the sentence starts “There are increasing moreetc”
3. **Matters arising from the 28th September 2016 meeting**
 - Cllr CD reports on para 5 (New Residents Issues) – that various emails and letters have been exchanged regarding this matter and that a survey is being done and consultation with residents is taking place. **ACTION:- CD**

 - Wrote to request ERA presence at Eastcote Craft Fair, since the meeting it has been confirmed that ERA can have table in Ascott Car Park.
 - This years Christmas lights are blue & white and there will be a Festive Shop Window Competition.
 - Asked for update from Chamber of Commerce (CofC) re light switch on and met with CofC on Monday. Since then have asked for further clarification and have as yet had no reply.
 - Sent congratulations to volunteers via Lesley Crowcroft (EHG and Long Meadow), Rob Cousins (Pinn Meadows) and Steve Place (Highgrove Woods) for achieving Gold Awards in London in Bloom.
 - Will be meeting with Access Officer to discuss pavements. **ACTION:- AH**
 - ERA Member NC attended Community Liaison Group Meeting at Northolt as neither CG or AH were able to attend.
 - runway will be closed for resurfacing from May next year for 6 months so there will only be helicopter traffic around during this period.
 - discussions about the dangers of drones and laser pen

6.4 Newsletter - LL

- AH thanked LL and DH for producing an excellent Newsletter. LL confirmed that the spring edition will be her last one, so it will be necessary to find someone to take over and work with LL on the spring edition. AH thanked LL for all her hard work over the years. LL/CD brought to our attention the problem of the weight of the magazine and the size of the boxes used by the printer. After a lengthy discussion, a 24 page limit was suggested and that the printer be asked to use smaller boxes.

6.6 Planning – JR

- JR issued a report which will be circulated with these minutes. She also highlighted the following:-
 - **Tudor Lodge – roof tiles** - Works to replace the tiles that do not match the existing are now underway.
 - **Decision Notices taking more than 8 weeks** - Where decision dates are shown to be longer than 8 weeks on the Planning website, this information has been added to the attached planning report and JR will endeavour to keep this information up to date on each report.
 - **Results of applications going before the North Planning Committee on 4th October:-**
 - 50 Rodney Gardens - recommended for refusal - refused
 - (Land) Adjacent to 29 & 33 Dollis Crescent – recommended for refusal – application withdrawn prior to the meeting
 - 1 Rushmoor Close – recommended for approval – approved
 - **3 Pikes End** – This application is to be heard by the North Planning Committee, this evening, 26th October. It is recommended for refusal. The Officer's report states that a decision was delayed due to giving the Applicant the opportunity to make changes to the application such that it might be accepted.

6.7 SNT/Police – CH

CH report on Eastcote and East Ruislip SNT meeting:-

- This was the first meeting for Sergeant Rob Geraghty, the new Ward Sergeant.
- Crime figures were broadly the same as during the previous period. Burglaries remain the largest concern; a number of them involved access through open windows or by rear access.
- CH raised the issues about the Eastcote Station alleyway and the Cheney Street one way system -- the SNT agreed to look into these but also said that the shops had CCTV coverage of the alleyway.
- Another resident raised concerns about suspicious vehicles parked near Missouri Court.

6.10 HARA (Hillingdon Alliance of Residents Associations) – IG.

- IG reports that the speaker for the September meeting was Joan Davies from Community Voice, as her report was very long IG can email it to anyone interested.
- The speaker for the November meeting is Robin Brown entitled "Towards a Community Led Plan for London and Hayes". There is a booklet to accompany this talk but it is 78 pages

long. IG will try and ascertain if it is possible to obtain a hard copy.

7. A.O.B.

- CG reported on his recent meeting at the Eastcote Cricket Club where they gave details of their forthcoming plans for the future of the Club.
- It has come to our attention that building work is being carried out at the Black Horse Public House.
- IM gave a report on what is happening in Pinner.
 - The two Zebra Crossings are being relocated.
 - The rebuilding work on the Heath Robinson building is nearly complete and the house is now open on Friday, Saturday and Sundays only for the moment.
 - Harrow Council proposes to build flats on part of the Waxwell Lane Car Park despite objections.
 - The Harrow Arts Centre in Hatch End are in dispute with Harrow Council and if the dispute is not resolve the Centre will have to close next March.
 - The Boundary Commission has announced boundary changes to Pinner and Hatch End.
 - The Pinner Post Office is moving to W.H.Smiths on the 13th November, the sorting office and parcel collection will remain in the present building.
- 2017 AGM – This has been booked and paid for – **Tuesday 30th May 2017**. A suggestion was made that we have someone from the Council and CG agreed to contact Jean Palmer for her advice on who to approach. **ACTION:- CG**
- OPEN FORUM – Tuesday 15th November – separate tables with one committee member on each table to encourage members to participate and ask questions. There will be a table by the door with sheets for people to fill in if they are prepared to become Road Stewards. IG will liaise with the church regarding collecting the key. Cllr CD gave her apologies for this meeting.
